Now that was a pleasant experience!

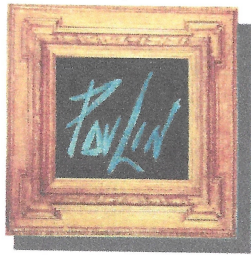
I can see why you rate it so highly. The bottle kinda gives the hint of what it's all about : (double barreled). It definitely has both barrels firing at the same time and it makes me wonder how many barrels there are in their \$499 bottle of the Bootleg series!

That being said, This sissy prefers a smooth Single Malt - preferably from Islay whether from the peat bog section of the island or the peatless variety which is less pungent.

I'm not fussy. (It all depends on what day it is.)

I like my whiskey (Scotch, i.e.) single malt and silky rather than leathery. Bourbon and straight whiskey as Heaven's Door is, is definitely a southern gentleman's drink! And it sure makes a great waker-upper after a difficult night of bad sleep. After a few sips, my innards were absolutely transformed. I would wager my stomach now probably has a much better tan than I would have on my skin after a full sunny summer.

So what's the taste like? As stated above, superbly powerful. The impact solid (to be expected with 100 proof and 50% ALC.' and even more powerful than my 56.2% Machrie Moore! But, despite the slap in the chops of Revelation, I have to say I prefer it to Canadian or the more subtle taste of Irish Whiskey. After a few sips, my eyes were brighter and my post smoker-of-too-many-years throat was singing your praises for the offering.



All in all, compared to Scotch this not only puts hair on your chest, it probably guarantees that after fifty years in the grave, it'll still be curly and full like Samson's before Delilah came into the picture!
